ARCHERY INTERMEDIATE INSTRUCTOR
(This course sets you up to be able to certify the Basic Instructor Course)
April 22nd and 23rd, 2010

Audience: Instructors with little or no archery experience who will be working in a more established archery program i.e. JOAD, ASAP, Parks/Recreation, College Archery Program (CAP)

Purpose: Introduce basic shooting steps, safety, range set-up; equipment setup and repair, fitting equipment to an archer, how to teach archery and how to teach a Basic Instructor Course.

LNT Trainer Course
April 19, 20 and 21, 2010

Successful graduates of the Trainer Course gain the skills to teach Leave No Trace techniques and ethics to their clients, friends and family.

Participants learn the concepts of Leave No Trace and prepare to teach Leave No Trace curriculum in a variety of settings-schools, camps, parks, wilderness and front country areas. Workshop topics include the underlying ethics and seven principles of Leave No Trace.

American Red Cross Small Craft Safety
April 19th, 2010

Gain the information and skills necessary to prevent, recognize, and respond to canoeing emergencies. This course will teach you how to protect yourself while assisting others.

The program provides individuals already skilled in canoeing with a core lesson in basic water rescue skills and knowledge needed for self-rescue and to assist others. The core lesson also includes information on small craft accident prevention, trip planning, supervision, and emergency preparation. In addition to the core lesson, there is a canoeing component that provides the skills needed to enable an individual to respond to a small craft emergency, as well as self-rescue skills.

Prerequisites: Tread water for one minute; swim 25 yards without a lifejacket. Please note that this is not an instructional course. All participants must have prior experience and strong boating skills in canoeing.

Cost-\$60 (Includes room and board)

American Red Cross Wilderness & Remote First Aid (2 full days)
April 20-21st, 2010

(Girl Scouts--this counts as a Level 2 First Aid course)

This 16-hour course is for those who work, live or play in remote areas - away from the usual EMS service. Even though the emergency workers near these areas may be trained to search for and rescue those in need, there may be a delay in the notification for assistance, the time required to get to the patient, or in moving the patient to more advanced treatment. Topics covered include: head, neck, and spinal injuries; wounds and wound infection; hypothermia; heat-related emergencies; allergies and anaphylaxis; altitude-related illnesses; bone and joint injuries; and burns.

Participants will be issued a certificate from the American Red Cross that is good for two years. You may also earn

1.6 CEUs for this course. Girl Scouts--this counts as a Level 2 First Aid course.

Prerequisites: Course participants must be at least 14 years of age and possess current certification in Adult CPR/AED.
